

Monthly comment

Over the reporting period, the broad equity market recorded an increased volatility. This development had a significant impact on the performance of Partners Group Listed Investments SICAV – Listed Infrastructure, which from the asset managers' point of view, cannot be attributed to the fundamental development of the portfolio companies for various reasons. Especially the long-term regulated cash flows of the underlying companies as well as inflation protection measures such as inflation-linked earnings should counteract the NAV-development of the previous months.

During the reporting month, various portfolio companies published positive annual results. For example, the French toll road operator, Vinci, has increased its revenues over the last year and is expecting a solid business-development for 2018. Despite the company's negative performance in February, its share price managed to recover after the announcement of its positive business development. Furthermore, Italian distributors also contributed negatively to the month's performance, as investors showed concerns regarding the uncertain outcome of the parliamentary elections on the 4th March.

On the other hand, the French satellite operator, Eutelsat influenced the fund in a positive manner. The company published favorable half-year results with an improved operating profit margin, due to good progress in cost control and cash flow generations.

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Definitions

Infrastructure

This monthly report is produced based on information available on the last working day of the month.

The term 'infrastructure' comprises all durable capital goods which ensure the proper development of an economy. They comprise transportation infrastructure assets such as roads, airports, railways, harbours, tunnels and bridges. However, they also include assets of the communication infrastructure, such as TV and radio transmission systems, antennas and transmission towers for mobile phones, satellite systems and cable networks. Infrastructure also refers to utility assets in the fields of energy and water, such as energy facilities for power generation and distribution, of gas and oil exploration and distribution, as well as other water supply and distribution facilities, including desalination plants and sewage treatment facilities. Finally, infrastructure also includes the provision of services in the fields of education and health, as

well as public sector building facilities (social infrastructure).

Listed infrastructure A 'listed infrastructure' company is listed on a stock exchange and its purpose is investing in infrastructure assets.

Total returnTotal return is calculated according the standard BVI-method of the Bundesverband Investment and Asset Management.
